Information regarding Miss Mortimer's resignation from the Council had been circulated to the Councillors prior to the meeting. There are now two vacancies to be advertised.

The newsletter provides an update on policing from the East, West and South policing areas of the County and an explanation of the Constabulary budget and the level of Council Tax to be charged for policing in Suffolk for the coming year.

PC Jon Gerrish will be attending and if it turns out to be a success then it may be possible to arrange quarterly meetings which could be valuable for the communities.

County Councillor's Report, Mr R Lindsay (short report submitted and circulated to

Councillors, follows these minutes)

Mr Lindsay is still not well enough to attend meetings. Mr Reeve to contact the Leader of the Council to ascertain whether it might be possible to refer any enquiries or problems to another Member until Mr Lindsay is recovered.

District Councillor's Report, Mr C Arthey

Mr Arthey noted that Mrs Maybury had circulated a brief report which included details of the new Housing Assistance Policy which was approved on 11^{th} December 2019. The Grants for Home Adaptations (minor) which stood at a limit of £5,000 has been increased to £7,500. Residents who have a need are encouraged to apply for this, it is not means tested for private homes and tenants can also apply.

The draft General Fund and Housing Revenue Account budgets will be presented to Cabinet next Tuesday (11th Feb). They provide for a 3.1% increase in Council Tax (+£5 per annum for a band 'D' dwelling), and a rent rise of 2.7% (+£2.19 per week average).

Also in the budget is an increase from $\pounds 2$ to $\pounds 3$ for long term parking in the Council's car parks, and a new 3 year rolling commitment to funding contribution for Sudbury CAB of $\pounds 53,500$ per annum. Both budgets go to full Council for final approval.

Also going to Cabinet next week is the Joint Area Parking Management Plan ahead of Civil Parking Enforcement powers transferring to the District Council in April.

Last week there was a two day exhibition in Sudbury to show various projects and proposals for the town. They included Kingfisher Leisure Centre, Gainsborough's House, St Peters, Market Hill, and Belle Vue house and park.

Work is also underway to build Hadleigh's new pool. The current pool will close on 20th March.

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Saving the best to last, Lavenham's revised CIL bid for £190,000 towards the Gas Works site just scraped into this bid round with final details received hours before the papers were prepared for printing! It is likely that community project funding will be capped at £75,000 in the next bid round, so if the application had slipped into the next round there may well have been £115,000 less available. Final approval of bids is at Cabinet in early March.

Mr Reeve reported that he will be attending a meeting to discuss possible piloting of a scheme whereby Parish Councils could be given delegated authority to determine small householder applications.

The Lavenham Priory application goes before the Committee for a decision next Wednesday, the 12th. Mr Sheppard will be speaking on behalf of the Parish Council.

<u>The Minutes</u> – Prop. by Mr O'Mahony, sec. by Mrs Twitchett, the minutes of the meeting held on 2^{nd} January 2020 were approved. Carried.

02(i)/20 08 Receipt of Lavenham Parish Council's Precept Upon the Charging Authority with a precept for 2020/21 of £80,000.00 has been acknowledged by Babergh D C. This will be paid to the Parish in two instalments, 50% in April 2020 and 50% in September 2020. This precept gives the Parish a Council Tax Band D amount of £88.14. This is an increase of 4.96% on 2019/20. These are the amounts that will be shown on the Council Tax Bill.

Dr Posner proposed, Mr Lamont seconded, that the financial transactions are approved. Carried.

<u>Financial update</u> – an update of income and expenditure up to 31^{st} December 2019 had been circulated. In reply to a query regarding the estimated costs of street cleaning, Councillors were reminded that a grant covering part of the costs is received from Babergh D C. It was proposed by Mr Sheppard, seconded by Mr Lamont, that the financial update is approved. Carried.

<u>Tree Works quotations</u> – three quotations had been received from Suffolk Tree Services, for works on the First Meadow £2,030, annual works to remove ivy, self-set trees and brambles at the Cemetery and trimming the Laurel hedge £600, tree surgery at Old Gas Works site £700. Prop. Dr Posner, sec. Mr O'Mahony, accept all three quotations. Arrangements will have to be made for access to the Gas Works site.

Also, as works to the Goat Willow are on the Common rather than the First Meadow, a letter will be sent to Mr Steed to check that he approves and also ask if he would also approve some additional tree planting on the Common.

Operations

<u>Gas Works site</u> – the CIL bid has already been touched on in our District Councillor's report. A keyholder had been present on site on Friday 31st January and contractors had been allowed to view the site. Three construction quotes had been received by 11 am. on the following Monday. A concern had been raised because one of the contractors had noticed, and queried, a mushroom shaped ventilator beside a manhole cover which did not appear on the Atkins report. Mr O'Mahony will pursue the purpose of this. National Grid want the Parish Council to sign up to Heads of Terms.

Historic England will be invited to get involved with the site again.

The Town and Parish Liaison meetings had raised the subject of management capacity and it was agreed that inter-Parish talks should take place to compare experiences.

Dr Posner commented that this project had come a long way and congratulated all those who had been involved so far.

<u>LED Street Lighting</u> – Mr Lamont had been informed that three more lights should be installed in the next week.

<u>SCC and BDC lists update</u> – it was thought that little will happen in respect of the SCC lists until Mr Lindsay is back. Somebody has been instructed in respect of BDC leases but not Heads of Terms are available yet. It was proposed by Mr O'Mahony, seconded by Mrs Norman, and agreed, that the planning application for works to the Prentice Street toilets and car park should be progressed based on the drawings circulated. A CIL bid could be put forward in April, the bid month is May. A contribution will also be made by the Parish Council towards the works.

Lavenham Walk – Dr Posner had made a second Freedom of Information application to SCC.

Housing and Social

<u>Good Neighbours Scheme and Dementia Alliance</u> – the monthly Common Room tea had taken place today, a full house with 18 attending plus helpers and a speaker arranged via the Co op on the subject of Tax, Care and Toyboys. This had been very interesting and prompted many questions.

The year's programme has been arranged and includes two trips and the Christmas Party which will be held on Friday 11th December. The Scheme is going really well.

Sue Calver is again involved with the Dementia group and this is being linked to the

02(i)/20 10 Sudbury Dementia Action Alliance. It is very quiet at the moment and new ways of spreading the word are being considered including information sessions. The GNS, Dementia group and Bereavement group will be represented at the Parish Council community engagement events. The Dementia Group Ipswich, run from the Sue Ryder Home, are coming out to visit. An outing is planned for April.

Correspondence had been received from:

Janey Auchincloss, requesting permission to hold the Gardeners Market on the Market Place again during the Hidden Gardens event, the date will be Sunday 7th June. As this took place last year this was approved.

John Pawsey thanking the Parish Council for their very generous donation towards the memorial to the men of the 487th Bomb Group from Lavenham Airfield.

Dinah James of the Lavenham Tour Guides regarding the display of their posters on the village notice boards The notice boards and protocol for their use are to be discussed at a future meeting.

A Lavenham resident had contacted the website thanking the Parish Council for its efforts to clear the parked vehicles from the corner of Bridge Street Road/Church Street, he felt this had made the junction much safer for vehicles and people on foot, although it was a pity that one vehicle continues to manage to park on the pavement there.

John Sparkes, Executive of Suffolk Neighbourhood Watch Assocation asking if the Parish Council would consider supporting them with a donation, $\pounds 50$ suggested by them. At the moment there is no NW scheme operating in Lavenham. Advice to be sought as to what would be involved in the possible starting of a new scheme in the village, or whether there are more efficient ways of disseminating information about crime patterns etc.

Street Naming, Hopkins Homes site on Melford Road

It was agreed that some of the historic Lavenham family names should be suggested for the road(s) on this development.

Christmas Fair and Christmas lighting

A meeting is planned for Thursday 27th February in order to engage with the village businesses and seek new and additional volunteers.

Village events - VE day anniversary; VW weekend

FOLA is bringing groups together to co-ordinate village events. The Parish Council is not leading but will support and continue to liaise. It is expected that dedication of the memorial to honour the US military service members from Lavenham who died in World War 2 will take place on Sunday 10th May.

The request from the VW group to use the First Meadow was now for use as a display area not trading/overnight camping.
